



These are all the supplies the VEEG technologist (tech) uses for a VEEG.



This is a picture of the dryer and the pump. The pump makes lots of noise when it pushes the air through the dryer. Unlike your dryer at home, this dryer blows cold air.




The "tech" will mark the places where leads will be placed with a red marker.




The "tech" will place a lead on each spot where there is a red dot.



The "tech" uses the dryer to dry the glue, so the lead will stay in place on each marked spot. Some children say the glue has a strong smell.




The "tech" checks to see that all the leads are in the right places. You can see yourself on the monitor.



These are all the lines on the EEG monitor. The "tech" looks at these lines and can tell that the leads are in the right places.



Children wear the relay box in a blue bag. Your head will be wrapped in white gauze and sticky gauze that comes in many different colors. What's your favorite color?



Whoever stays with you during your VEEG will press a button when you have a seizure. Then, on a special journal they will write down what happened during your seizure and what you were doing when it happened.



Remember, you won't be on camera when you use the bathroom.



When your VEEG is finished, the VEEG "tech" will take the leads off of your head. Remember - a wet wash cloth can help to stop the glue remover from bothering your eyes.



The VEEG is finished. Now it's time to go home.
