- Blood disorders (hemophilia, sickle cell anemia)
- Respiratory system disorders (cystic fibrosis, chronic lung disease) •
- Endocrine, nutritional & metabolic disorders (PKU, thyroid problems or diabetes)
- · Genitourinary system disorders (serious kidney problems)
- · Gastrointestinal system disorders (biliary atresia)
- Serious birth defects (cleft lip/palate, spina bifida)

- Nervous system disorders (cerebral palsy, uncontrolled epilepsy)
